Paddler's Notes

- **23.9 Mile**Rocky Carrie Park Access, Lugerville River: This scenic park offers easy access where the river forms a wide pool in the outflow from Rocky Carrie Rapids. Downstream, the river narrows and quietly flows past dense forest and marsh. Shuttle: On County Highway F in Lugerville, turn north onto Rocky Carrie Rd and drive for 0.7 mile to Rocky Carrie Park. Hand carry access, picnic area, parking.
- **22.8 Mile**County F Bridge Access, Lugerville River: The river is calm and slow for about 3/4 of a mile until Kashinski Rapids. An ATV bridge spans the river 400 yards downriver from the road bridge. Hardwoods and brush cover both banks. Shuttle: On County Highway F, the bridge is on the west side of Lugerville. The river access is 50 yards east of the bridge where a narrow track leads down to the river. Hand carry access, roadside parking.
- **22.2 Mile Mount Pelee Creek, Kashinski Rapids (Class 1)**The marshy outlet of Mt Pele Creek is on river left, just before a sharp right bend. The rapids occur after the bend where the river splits around a tiny island. Both forks are navigable during normal flows. Below the rapids, occasional riffles occur over the next 0.8 mile until Stonewall Rapids.
- **21.4 Mile** Stonewall Rapids (Class 2) The river constricts and picks up speed as it heads into Stonewall Rapids. A fun class 2 named after a stone wall on the left bank below the rapids. Scout from river left. More rapids follow a brief stretch of calm water.
- **20.1 Mile Smith Creek** A series of riffles runs past the wide creek mouth, which enters from river right.
- **Niebauer Springs River Access** *River:* The landing is on river left in a long right bend. A white sign reads 'Niebauer Pond Landing'. The river moves slowly throughout this stretch with lots of overhanging trees, and dense underbrush covering the banks. *Shuttle:* From County F, turn south onto South Fork Road, then turn west onto Crane & Chase Road, then turn north onto Access River Road. An entrance sign reads 'Flambeau River Access below Niebauer Springs State Fishery Area'. The river is a short hike down a jeep track from the parking area. Hand carry access, trailer turnaround, parking.
- **19.1 Mile** Rock Ledge Rapids (Class 1-2) About a third of a mile past a large island you will come upon a large stone shelf on the right bank. The rapids begin downstream and run for over 200 yards through a long left bend. There is a spot on river right for paddlers to either rest or camp.
- **18.4 Mile** Davis Rapids (Class 1-2) Riffles and scattered boulders lead into a short, tight, and fast boulder garden. The rapids require some maneuvering around several large boulders. The whitewater ends in a wide pool with several islands.
- **18.0 Mile** Clubhouse Rapids (Class 1) The river flows through a right bend and constricts into a short, rocky rapids. A wide pool and several islands follow.
- **17.1 Mile Flambeau Town Access** *River:* The landing is on river left in a long stretch of flat-water, surrounded by dense forest. A white sign that reads 'Flambeau Town Access' marks the access. **Shuttle:** From County F, turn south onto S Fork Road, then turn east onto Crane and Chase Road, then turn north onto River Rd, then turn left onto Power Line Road, the river access is at the end. A wide grassy trailer access lane leads down to the river. Trailer access ramp, parking.

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16.5 Mile Nelson Creek The wide mouth of Nelson Creek is on river right.

15.7 Mile Carl's Rapids (Class 1) The rapids run for 150 yards through a right bend. They're more riffles than

rapids during normal and higher flows.

14.0 Mile Elk River Confluence The river enters from river left near two large islands. Several small islands

appear as you approach the Highway W Bridge.

13.5 Mile County W Bridge Landing River: The Landing is on river left, immediately below the County W Bridge.

Shuttle: On County W, east of the bridge, turn south onto Down River Road. The landing entrance is immediately on your right, where a wide, rutted lane leads down to the river. Hand carry access, parking.
