Hiking

Story Hill Nature Trail
 Hike to a scenic overlook of the Brule River Valley
 Trailhead: 46.53165, -91.59268
 Distance & Time: 1.7 miles, loop, allow up to 1.5 hours
 Trail Surface: Packed-dirt
 Rocks & Roots: Occasional
 Difficulty: Moderate
 Terrain: Hilly
 Elevation Gain: 186 feet
 Assurance Markers: Yes, trail markers & map signs

Historic Boyfield Road Trail
 The trail follows a partial segment of the historic Boyfield - Superior Road built in 1870. Features a scenic overlook, site of the Percival Mine, and the stone foundation remains of the miners' quarters
 Trailhead: 46.61233, -91.61520
 Distance & Time: 2.2 miles, loop, allow up to 1.5 hours
 Trail Surface: Packed-dirt
 Rocks & Roots: Occasional
 Difficulty: Easy to Moderate
 Terrain: Moderate to Difficult
 Elevation Gain: 250 feet
 Assurance Markers: Yes, trail markers & map signs

North Country Trail
 Samples Rd to Highland Town Hall (County Hwy 5)
 This segment traverses through mixed hardwood and pine forests, pine plantations, sandy pine barrens, and open fields. There are 3 backpack campsites and a spur to the Bois Brule Campground

 Highland Town Hall Parking: 46.62571, -91.66861
 Distance & Time: 12.3 miles, point-to-point, allow up to 7 hours
 Trail Surface: Packed-dirt
 Rocks & Roots: Occasional to Moderate
 Difficulty: Moderate to Difficult
 Terrain: Flat to Rolling
 Elevation Gain: 908 feet
 Assurance Markers: Yes, trail blaze markers

State Forest Campgrounds

Bois Brule Campground
 Tall red pines shade this scenic, hillside campground. Every campsite is within walking distance of the river and two walk-in tent/canoe campsites offer riverside camping

 The campground sits in a mixed hardwood and pine forest. Every campsite is within walking distance of the river including three walk-in tent sites. A wide, 40-yard-long trail leads to the campground landing

 There are 274 of well-maintained trails groomed for both classic and skate skiing. Difficulty varies from beginner to advanced. There are also 3 km of snowshoe trails.
