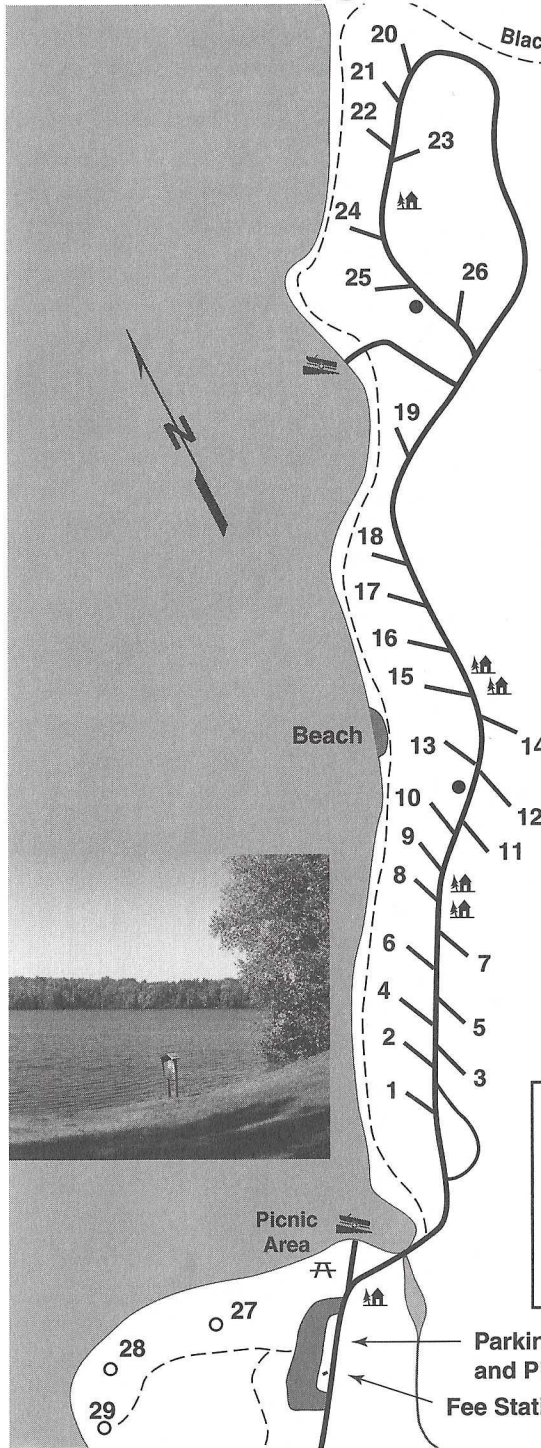


Black Lake Campground



Attractions

- The campground is located in a paper birch, red pine, and spruce forest on the east shore of Black Lake
- 21 sites are next to the lake
- The 4-mile Black Lake Trail which interprets the logging history of Black Lake starts at the campground and goes around Black Lake
- The campground has a beach and two boat launch sites
- Black Lake (129 acres) has good fishing for musky, largemouth bass, northern, and panfish
- Near the Elk release site
- Paved road within the campground
- Many lakes and rivers near by

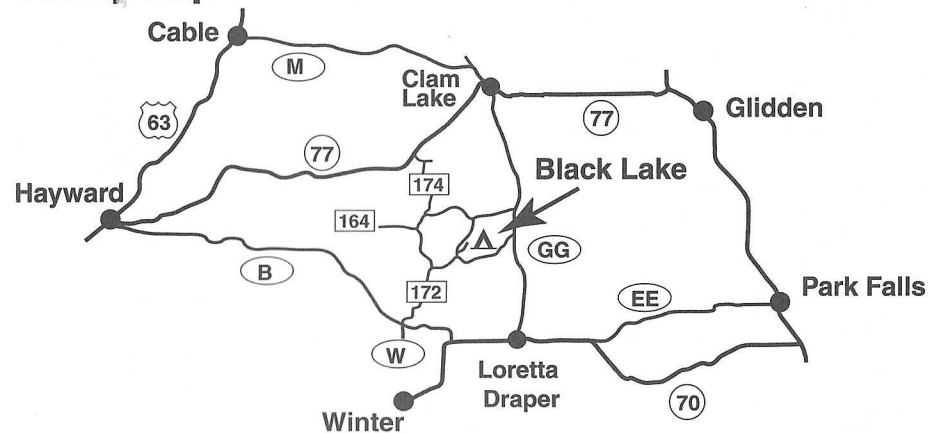

Directions to Black Lake Campground

- From Hayward drive east on County Highway B 23 miles to the intersection with Highway W. Turn left (north) on Barker Lake Road and drive 4.7 miles to the intersection with Fishtrap Road. Continue straight on FR 172 three miles, turn left (north) on FR 173. Go 0.4 miles turn right (east) on the paved campground road (FR 1666).
- From Loretta Draper drive west on Highway 70 5 miles to County Highway B. Turn right (north) on B and drive 4.5 miles to County Highway W. Turn right (north) on Barker Lake Road and drive 4.7 miles to the intersection with Fishtrap Road. Continue straight on FR 172 three miles, turn left (north) on FR 173. Go 0.4 miles turn right (east) on the paved campground road (FR 1666).
