Big Lake Campground, sites 1801-1870, is located 19.8 miles northwest of the Crystal Lake Visitor Station and campground in the northern portion of the forest. This 835-acre lake is known for excellent fishing of walleye, musky and smallmouth bass, and has a boat landing for campers. The campground also offers an open beach area and bathrooms close by. If you are looking for quiet, spaced-out sites, the back loop may be just what you are looking for. Lake sites offer wonderful views from the campground on the northwest corner of the lake.

TICKS AND LYME DISEASE

Ticks are common across
Wisconsin and may be found in
the forest. Lyme disease is an
illness that can be spread to
humans from the bite of a tick.
You can protect yourself against
Lyme disease and other tick-borne
diseases by practicing these tips:

- · Stay in the middle of trails.
- Apply insect repellent on exposed skin and over clothes.
- Wear light-colored clothes to spot ticks more easily.
- Do a full-body tick check after outdoors activities.

CAMPING RESERVATIONS

Camping reservations are required and can be made for the same day of your arrival or up to 11 months in advance of your planned date of occupancy.

Campers must make a reservation before setting up on any site.

VEHICLE STICKER

A vehicle admission sticker is required on all motor vehicles within the campgrounds at Northern Highland-American Legion State Forest.


CAMPGROUND RULES

- All campers must make a reservation before setting up on any site.
- Checkout Time: Must vacate site by 3 p.m. on the last day of the permit.
- Campground/Day-use Areas and Closing Time: Campground closed to nonregistered campers 11 p.m. to 6 a m
- Pets must be on a leash at all times and not left unattended.
- Noise may not interfere with the enjoyment of the forest by others.
- Generators may be used from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Camping Party: A "non-family group" may not exceed six people. A "family" is limited to parents with their dependent children and not more than two guests.
- A State Parks and Forest Admission Sticker is required for camping.
- For complete rules and regulations, see Chapter NR 45, Wis. Admin. Code, or contact DNR Law Enforcement.
