Assurance Markers: Yes, trail markers & map signs at junctions

Dry Lake Trail

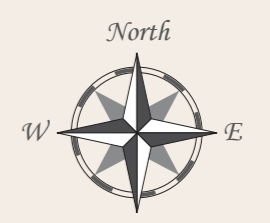
Distance & Time: 1.8 miles, loop, allow up to 1 hour, 30 minutes
Trail Surface: Packed-dirt, erosion steps, footbridges
Rocks & Roots: Occasional
Difficulty: Easy
Terrain: Hilly
Elevation Gain: 260 feet
Assurance Markers: Yes, trail markers & map signs at junctions

Circle Trail

Distance & Time: 4.5 miles, loop, allow up to 2 hours, 30 minutes
Trail Surface: Packed-dirt, erosion steps, footbridges
Rocks & Roots: Occasional
Difficulty: Easy
Terrain: Hilly
Elevation Gain: 690 feet
Assurance Markers: Yes, trail markers & map signs at junctions

Ice Age Trail

Chippewa Moraine Segment, 167th Street at Plummer Lake to 267th Ave
Distance & Time: 7.6 miles, point-2-point; allow up to 5 hours
Trail Surface: Packed-dirt, erosion steps, footbridges
Rocks & Roots: Occasional
Difficulty: Moderate
Terrain: Hilly
Elevation Gain: 675 feet
Assurance Markers: Yes, trail blazes. There are markers and map signs on the Chippewa Moraine Recreation Area trails
